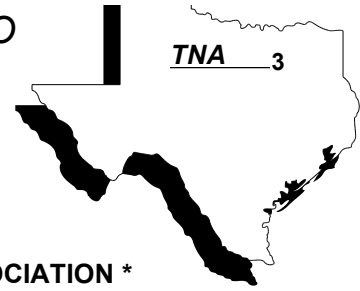

## President's Message

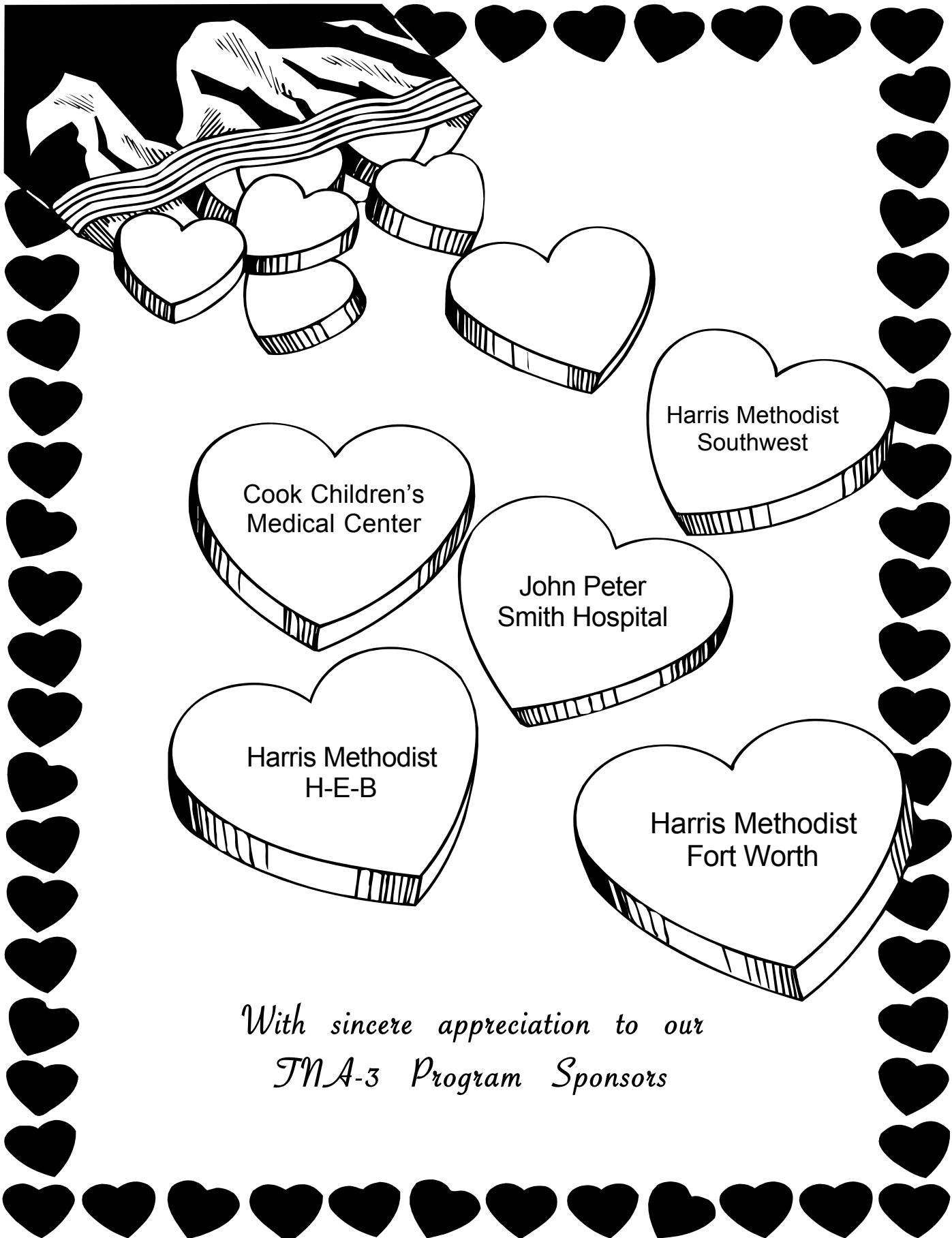
Happy New Year!

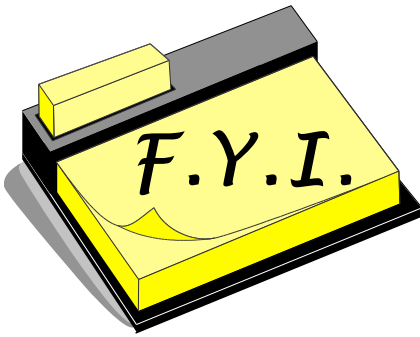

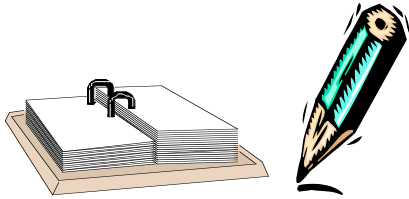

## **Congratulations!**

Mildred O. Hogstel, Ph.D., R.N., C., member of TNA District 3, recently received two honors. On October 17, 2002, she was made an honorary alumni of Harris School of Nursing at Texas Christian University in Fort Worth, Texas. Although she did not graduate from TCU, she taught there for 33 years and has continued to teach part-time since her official retirement in 1994.

Dr. Hogstel also received a Lifetime Achievement Award from the National Gerontological Nursing Association at their convention in Arlington Park, Illinois October 10-13, 2002. Dr. Hogstel is a registered nurse with national certification in the specialty of gerontological nursing. She has authored or co-authored sixteen books, most of which were on the topic of aging, and has had numerous publications in national health-related journals and other publications. One of her books has been translated into French, one into Italian, and one into Japanese. She is active in several organizations related to aging in Fort Worth including the Tarrant County Commission on Aging. Most of her career has been devoted to improving the lives and health of older people.
