







What's Your Story?

I attended my first TNA Leadership Forum in Austin in October. It was an awesome experience to be in the same room with nurses that have a passion for service to mankind and a drive to make nursing a profession of critical thinkers, problem solvers but most of all the best advocates for what they do each day; provide for the well being of their clients and patients.

An activity that really focused on what kept us in nursing provided an opportunity for thought and reflection and was called "What's Your Story". We divided up into groups of eight each sitting at different tables than when we started the conference and had a defined time period to tell a compelling story that was instrumental in keeping us in Nursing. A timekeeper called time so that everyone at each table got a chance to tell their story. We then changed tables, sat with a different group than previous, and started the process a second time. When we completed the second round of storytelling, we were asked to go place our hands on the person that we felt told the most compelling story. About 5 people were selected out of the entire group of participants. Each was allowed to tell their compelling story. All were moving in some way and inspiring in other ways. Many of us could identify with the stories told.

As the activity began, I was instantly returned in my mind to one of my compelling stories. I was working night shift providing care to a 17 year old cancer patient. His family had become distant due to divorce and anger. I charted in his room at night to provide company and often we shared cucumbers and ranch dip as a midnight snack. When his cancer went into remission and he was discharged, I did not hear from him. One night I came to work and he was on the patient list—his cancer had relapsed. After several weeks of intense chemotherapy and radiation, he went home to live out his last days. When I attended his funeral, a moving snapshot of a very short life, an audio interview done by the Youth Minister of his church was played where this young man talked as an aged wise man. He spoke of the friends and family he had and that none should be sad because he was going to Heaven and meet Jesus personally. There was not a dry eye in the group. As I left to go home, I spoke to his father and step mother. They asked my name and when I told them who I was, they looked at each other and smiled. "So you're the 11-7 Momma". I was dumbfounded because I never knew that in all those nights of charting quietly in his room and sharing food that he had nicknamed me. I realized that a bond had formed and I had connected with this child. When I am least expecting it this time in my career comes to minister to me in very uplifting ways and reconfirms that I am doing what I have been called to do.

In a reflective moment, I began wondering what other stories motivated one to continue to stand for long hours, administer complex care to a diverse population of patients, ignore personal needs to provide for another human being, prepare for a new group of students and come to work tomorrow.

Telling our story is a way to reaffirm our purpose and validate our profession. So, what's your story?

Gamma Knife Surgery Comments: A Description of Process and Feelings About It.

I had had low-grade headaches (1-2.5 on 1-10 scale) for about 2 months. . .no big deal, mostly pesky. My husband insisted that the doctor be called; I did so with some embarrassment as the inconvenience was minimal, even though dull pain was ever present. The doctor first ran a sinus series; it showed some congestion and a decongestant was prescribed. I was back in the office the following week for well-woman visit and commented that headaches were still there. After some discussion (you know it has to be justified to Medicare) a MRI was ordered; the most notable symptom was that I rarely have headaches. The afternoon of the MRI, the doctor called. . . . I thought uh oh. . . . The doctor said that there was a tumor in the cavernous sinus area close to the right carotid artery and optic nerve (middle of head, down 1/2 inch and over 1/2 inch to right). I also began having Healing Touch (a balancing of the energy field) treatments to augment usual care (I am a Certified Healing Touch Practitioner).

Next, I visited a neurologist who examined the data and stated that options were surgery (with hypothermia and heart-lung bypass) or "gamma knife radiation". . . called knife because of the precision that is possible, as differentiated from standard radiation that is more diffuse. I, then visited a neurosurgeon for more tests (carotid arteriogram, full body scan, etc.). All the information was presented to the nine member Gamma Knife Committee (neurosurgeons, oncology radiologists and physicists – to care for and run the machine) for evaluation of fit for the procedure. The decision was go! Procedure was scheduled for 11-2-04. I had a description of process and tour of the room, the machine is on the first floor. . .because of weight. A very knowledgeable nurse gave information. I went in at 6:30am, dressed in sweats (room was cold to me), for procedure. I was given an anti-anxiety medication . . . yes, psych nurses get anxious once in a while. The frame was screwed onto my head at four points (2 in front & 2 in back) just to the bone. I had another MRI, and returned to a room where I waited for an hour while the team consisting of a neurosurgeon, radiologist and physicist programmed the machine. The gamma knife radiation procedure has been around for 30 years; before computers, it took 24 hours to do calculations for the procedure. You are then put in machine (like MRI), the head frame is attached to a stainless steel "helmet". . .looks like a giant 24 inch colander with 201 holes, to direct the gamma rays exactly where you want them. Each beam in itself does no harm; the burn is at the juncture point. The process is quiet (MRIs are noisy). I was spaced out with meditation & medication for one hour. After the procedure, I went to recovery for 2 hours and ate a big breakfast! I then went home & out to dinner that night. . .I know the restaurant where we went but have no recollection of food, talk, etc. . .retrograde amnesia.

Then, life as usual. Well, that is not quite true. The headaches have decreased, but will likely to be around for 6 months. The tumor was "burned" & hopefully no longer growing. It is, however, still there. It will very slowly disintegrate & some will always be there. Comment by P.A. (didn't even rate seeing the physician) after follow-up MRI one month later was that "tumor is stable.". . which means no growth. It is probably a nonmalignant meningioma and could have been there 40-50 years, or even born with it. There will be follow up MRIs the rest of my life. It is a mind-blowing experience: a very serious tumor, any tumor in the brain is serious, that has been treated with no invasiveness and no side effects! This is Star Wars to the max!

Know that I was on many, many prayer lists and this definitely helped the medical personnel and the process to be successful. Faith and medical marvels! No symptom is too small or insignificant to be explored.



The letter of recommendation must address each of the following categories:

 - **SERVICE TO THE COMMUNITY**
 - **COMPASSIONATE CAREGIVER**
 - **SIGNIFICANT CONTRIBUTIONS**




