Her passion and hard work have led to two successive Clinical Excellence awards given by the Psychiatric-Mental Health Nurse Practitioner professors and was awarded University Scholar this Spring at UTA. In addition, she has volunteered since 2003 as an actor for the Psychiatric Management simulated practicum and served for three semesters on the Graduate Student Senate. Her experiences as a graduate teaching assistant (GTA) led her to complete required courses for a teaching certificate as a Nurse Educator in addition to her PMHNP courses.

In addition to ANA and TNA, she is a member of the American Psychiatric Nurses Association; and a member of Sigma Theta Tau, Delta Theta chapter, where she serves as the Communications Chair. Tara has been invited to speak publicly on several occasions while as a graduate student at University of Texas at Arlington at the National Teaching Institute and Critical-Care Exposition and in the Dominican Republic to advance the education of practicing nurses.

Her decision to become a PMHNP is based on the belief that mental health is a crucial component of overall health-- "The specialty maximizes my skills as a communicator, counselor and provider, impacting lives in ways that were not possible in my past nursing practice. This role makes it possible to increase community awareness, both grassroots and political, of mental health issues such as depression, domestic violence and substance abuse which greatly impact the health and future of individuals, families and communities".

Tara currently resides in Southlake with her children, a daughter age 19, and two sons ages 13 and 10, and two dogs. In her free time, she likes to run, bike, and keep score for her son's baseball teams. She is also currently trying to master the art of Tai Chi.

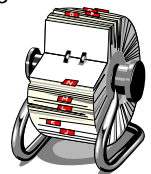

100 New Members to Celebrate 100 Years of TNA

At the turn of the century, nursing as a profession was in its infancy. The role of the nurse was nothing close to what it is today, and the education was considerably less. There was no governing board, or standards of care. So it was that a small group of graduate nurses came together, here in Fort Worth, one hundred years ago, to form the basis for what would become the Texas Nurses Association. Their mission was to improve the image of the profession, by seeking professional standards of education, and regulation of the practice of nurses. It was their efforts that brought about the professional recognition and respect we enjoy today.

In 2007, TNA will celebrate its centennial anniversary. Coincidentally, 2007 is also the year for the Board of Nurse Examiner's Sunset Review. Discussions nationwide about healthcare reform and expectations for nursing have made this an even more pressing concern. There has never been a more opportune moment to become involved in what nursing is, and what it will become in the future.

Our general meeting in October of 2006 will be focused on membership, and increasing involvement of area nurses in TNA. Our future lies with those who would continue the mission originally established by those who began this organization. We must look towards our future as a profession, while keeping a keen eye on our past. We have come far, but we need to continue to build upon the foundation laid for us.

Our challenge to you, as members, is simple. Our goal is "One hundred new members for one hundred years." One hundred new persons with the passion and willingness to step up and to be counted as not just a member of the profession, but as a member of the organization responsible for making nursing what it is today: a respected and sought after profession, with a standard and expectation of excellence. We are asking each member to participate in this simple challenge. Come to the October meeting, and bring a colleague. You could suggest participation in TNA to the students you encounter. Bring a student to the meeting to discover what TNA is, and what it will become. Find ways to reach others about TNA, and what it represents to them, and their profession. Letters which do not conform to these criteria will be disqualified.** The nomination letter **should not** include the nominee’s name or specific identification about the Registered Nurse (e.g., place of employment). The letter of recommendation must address each of the following categories:

- * **SERVICE TO THE COMMUNITY**
- * **COMPASSIONATE CAREGIVER**
- * **SIGNIFICANT CONTRIBUTIONS**

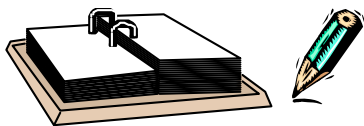
