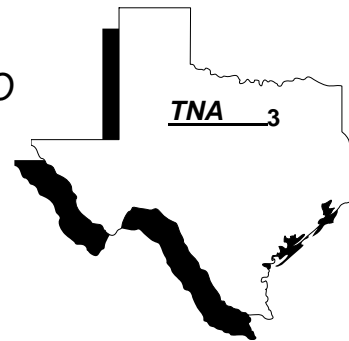

TNA was founded by graduate nurses in Fort Worth, Texas on February 22, 1907 but TNA District 3 celebrated the 100 year birthday of Texas Nurses Association, early, on February 15, 2007 in the traditional birthday party manner; with cake, punch, noise makers, party favors and guests.

One of our distinguished State Officers; Margie Dorman-O'Donnell, wished Texas Nurses Association a happy centennial birthday along with 126 other guests at the party. Party guests included area school of nursing students, and TNA members and visitors. The evening kicked off with recognition of such honored guest as past TNA District 3 Presidents, Great 100 Nurse recipients from the past, former TNA Executive Secretary Jane't Brown, and past TSNA Presidents.

The highlight of the evening was a historical overview of Texas Nurses Association presented by distinguished guests: Dr. Ferne C. Kyba, Dorothy E. Parker, M.S., R.N., Dr. Sue Ochsner, Dr. Sharon Judkins, and Dr. Gail Davis. Each of the guest speakers has played an intricate role in the growth of TNA District 3, as well as in pioneering projects at the state level and beyond, paving the way for District 3 nurses practicing today and in the future.

The evening closed with drawings for door prizes, including gift certificates to local establishments, and perhaps the most coveted prize of the evening; a poster donated by Dr. Kyba. Lygia Dunsworth, District 3 Vice President, won a trip and hotel accommodations to the 2007 TNA Nursing Leadership Conference scheduled in the fall in Austin when her name was drawn from those participating in the member-ship drive.

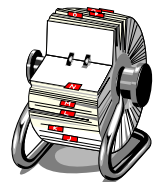

TNA North Region TEES UP 4th Annual Golf Tournament for FUN(D)

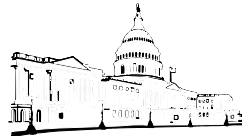

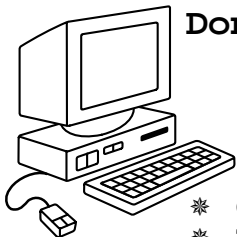

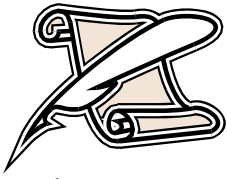

Update from TNA's
Governmental Affairs Committee

Many changes are on the horizon and it's important that nurses stay informed on what is happening at the Government Level. This is a Legislative year and what gets decided in Austin will have some level of impact on all areas of our profession.

The Sunset Advisory Commission is a 12 member committee comprised of a body of legislatures and public members appointed by the Lieutenant Governor and the Speaker of the House of Representatives. The Commission is Chaired by Senator Kim Brimer and Representative Vicki Truitt, Vice Chair. The committee was created by the Texas Legislature to identify and eliminate waste, duplication and inefficiency in government agencies. The 12 member Commission reviews the policies and programs of more than 150 government agencies every 12 years. In, most cases agencies under review are automatically abolished unless legislation is enacted to continue them. September 2006 the Sunset Commission reported on 8 issues and gave their recommendations that are available for viewing at www.sunset.state.tx.us and are also the TNA website.

The BNE has always had a strong relationship with the Sunset Commission. The BNE's level of professionalism and dedication to the public through the regulation of nurses has given the BNE a recognized reputation of being one of Texas's most well-run and effective agencies in the State. High expectations are placed on the BNE, and as a result the bar has been raised on Nursing as a whole. The TNA works in conjunction in making the nursing voice heard through the process when recommendations are made and legislation is created. Remember the BNE was created for the public, the TNA was created for you.

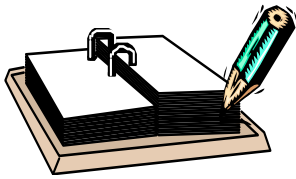
