

In the Spotlight....



Meet Dana Roper-Effinger, Vice
President / Chief Nursing Officer at Baylor All
Saints Medical Center. As a child, Dana
remembers her grandmother working in a nursing
home. She says that she loved the patients and
wanted to stay and help her grandmother. "I really
feel like that was the beginning of my direction
into healthcare," said Dana. After graduating from
high school, she attended a vocational college for
Respiratory Therapy. Dana worked in that field
for 10 years side by side with nursing. She soon
realized that her true calling was to

take care of all aspects of her patients and their families. Dana set a new career goal, and went back to school full time to get her RN.

As a nursing professional, Dana is a member of Texas Nurses Association for many reasons. Her membership allows her to stay in touch with the changes in legislation, Board of Nursing, education, research, patient safety, and peer review changes to name a few. She cites Texas Nursing Magazine as being very informative, and she explains that there are endless networking opportunities at TNA seminars and meetings. "As nurses, it is our responsibility to our patients to always be in tune with changes, best practices, and continuing our education through seminars and articles. TNA is one of the opportunities that we have to stay in touch with our evolving profession," said Dana.

In her current role, as Vice-President / Chief Nursing Officer, Dana feels that it is important for her to provide a vision and strategy on how to have the best patient outcomes. Dana supports nursing and works to ensure that the nursing division at Baylor All Saints has what they need to provide safe quality compassionate care. Dana explains, "At Baylor All Saints and Southwest we have a very unique opportunity for our nurses. We are privileged to have the Faxel foundation for nursing, which provides education, seminars (every nurse can spend up to 1,500 dollars a year at a seminar of their choice), and certification to include preparatory classes, tuition reimbursement and gifts. As the leaders, we must encourage and provide these opportunities to our staff, so they can grow professionally and stay current with their practice."

While working in the healthcare profession, Dana has seen a shift in nursing practice, which has had a positive impact on patient care. "Nursing has evolved in a way that as bedside nurses, we can drive practice through shared governance using evidence based practice. This improves our quality and patient outcomes. These are the people that are out there giving the care and know what needs to change and can make it happen," said Dana. She says that she feels fortunate to work in Healthcare, and blessed to work for the Baylor System and be surrounded with great employees who are caring and compassionate.

In her time away from the hospital, Dana, has volunteered as a house parent for the Warm Place; and she is currently serving on a committee to assist in the development of a not-for-profit clinic for the homeless, as part of the Union Gospel Mission of Tarrant County. On a personal note, Dana is married and enjoys outdoor activities, such as swimming, boating, and walking. She and her husband love to travel and spend time in Missouri at the lake.

Dana has received numerous nursing achievements and awards during her career; but says, "There is no feeling in the world that can replace the feeling that you have, when you know you have made a difference in someone's life."



Making A Difference
