Nursing History

Answer to November/ December Trivia Question

In what year was the State Nurses' Registration Act passed in Texas?

Answer:

The State Nurses' Registration Act was passed in **1909**, providing a legal structure for regulating practice and education in Texas.

The first to answer this question correctly was Vicki Patrick; second was Sharon Ransom. Thanks for participating!

The State Nurses' Registration Act was passed by the Texas Legislature in 1909 at a time when nurses were working to make nursing a viable profession that was built on standards for practice and education. Passage of the Act followed its adoption by the Texas Graduate Nurses' Association (TGNA) at its second meeting in 1908. It was important that the public be protected from poorly-prepared nurses, and registration required that nurses conform to set standards. Texas nurses joined the effort of nurses in other states, working for the passage of a nurse practice act that would regulate nursing practice and education.

Miss Mildred Bridges from Fort Worth, along with Miss M.M. McKnight of San Antonio, presented the Bill to TGNA for its consideration. It had been prepared by Judge Bell of Fort Worth.¹ While little

more is known about the specific activity of nurses in the Fort Worth area, it is likely that others were involved in the effort to pass the legislation since TGNA's organizational meeting was held in Fort Worth in 1907. Of the 19 charter members of the Association, five - Miss Bridges, Mrs. H. Paris, Miss Howard, Miss Murphy, and Mrs. Arnold – are known to be from Fort Worth.² An impetus for TGNA's organization was passage of legislation that would provide for the registration of nurses in Texas.³

The Board of Nurse Examiners (Texas Board of Nursing) was formed as part of the State Nurses' Registration Act. When the Board celebrated its 100-year anniversary in 2009, it noted that the first Registered Nurse licensed in Texas was from Fort Worth. She was Emma Lucinda Allison, a graduate of Fort Worth Medical College.⁴ (For more information about the Fort Worth Medical College, see

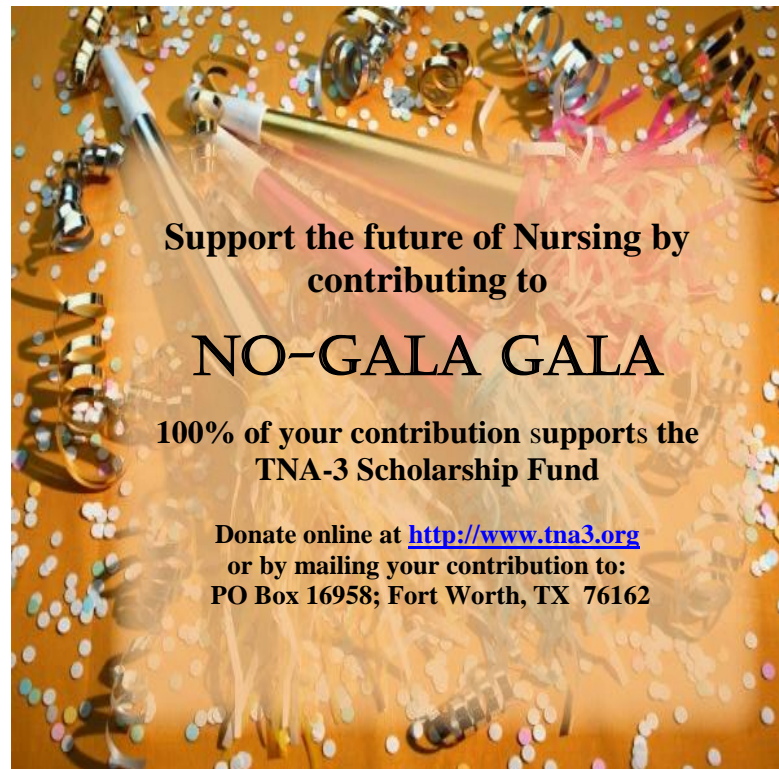

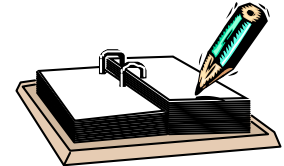
